### Call for Papers

*Armed Forces and Operations in Asymmetric Warfare Environments*

The ERGOMAS working group (WG) on "The Military Profession" announces a call for papers for a special workshop on the theme, *Armed Forces and Operations in Asymmetric Warfare Environments*, to be held in Turin in 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> February

The use of the military in environments of asymmetric war has always been more prevalent in recent years and this has certainly forced military professionals to face the challenge of new types of missions, missions that are different than those for which the formative period prepared them. In this framework and for the practical purpose to draw lessons from the experience gained in the field, the WG has launched the field research "Officer and Commander", whose features can be read on the last ERGOMAS Newsletter, or on the ERGOMAS website.

The Turin conference has a twofold purpose. First, to provide an **interim meeting** of the working group "The Military Profession," in order to take stock of the first results of the research quoted above that the group is now carrying on. The second is to offer the opportunity to all members of ERGOMAS and to other interested scholars, to come together and discuss a more general topic of great relevance today.

Papers in all areas touching on the general theme of the conference in national and international contexts are solicited. Given the breadth of this theme, panel submissions (groups of 3-4 papers on a similar theme) are enthusiastically solicited. Every effort will be made to group papers into relevant panels, so individual paper submissions are also welcome.

In relation to the general theme of the workshop, the following topics would be of particular interest (without wishing to restrict other proposals):

1. Aspects and problems of acceptance of death in action.
2. Diversity and cultural issues in multinational co-operations.
3. The military's functional or dysfunctional role in the international humanitarian intervention and state-building.
4. Impacts of asymmetric conflicts on military professional expertise, cohesion, representativeness and legitimacy.
5. Theoretical and practical aspects of military leadership.

Proposals (250 word abstracts, complete contact information for presenting authors) must be **received no later than December 15th, 2014**. Selection decisions will be communicated to presenting authors on or before January 10<sup>th</sup> 2015.
